Our Commitment to Families

Denver Christian School is a Christ-centered, college and career prep school that provides a world-class, whole-child education. Our mission is to inspire and equip students to engage the world with Christ's transforming power and love, while helping them **flourish every day in every way**.

By the time your child has graduated from DCS, they will:

- Have strong academic and spiritual foundations, with the ability to think creatively
- Understand their own interests and abilities, and how the development of these connects to their long-term success
- Seek God daily and discern His plan for their life
- Be able to take care of themselves physically and emotionally, and demonstrate empathy toward the needs of others
- Live intentionally in Christian community alongside others with diverse backgrounds, interests, and educational abilities

How do we put our mission into action to accomplish these goals?

Partner with parents.

DCS partners with parents to ensure there is a strong connection between each child's home and school. Every parent receives a weekly newsletter, teachers send classroom updates, and parents can check in at any time through Canvas, a webbased learning management system. On-campus volunteer opportunities are available through our Parent Association.

Place a strong emphasis on safety.

Environment matters, and students from early childhood to high school crave a sense of community, safety, and security. We offer small class sizes and a positive school culture where students are known well and mentored daily. Our campus is kept physically safe with a full time Director of Safety, surveillance cameras, locking doors, staff and volunteer background checks, and a radio communication network among staff. Our multi-level counseling team provides social-emotional support and has the tools to help students feel healthy and safe.

Teach biblical truths.

DCS provides a Christ-centered environment where teachers model their faith with intentionality and biblical truths permeate lessons across every subject. Students attend chapel regularly, are involved in a "Faith Family," where high schoolers get to mentor younger students, and participate in ongoing Christian service projects. DCS graduates embrace biblical truths as foundational components of their identity.

Value diverse learners.

No two children learn in the same way or at the same pace. Our Extend Learning Services and Inclusion program ensures that all students are supported and challenged appropriately. From those who need higher-level content in our Quest program, to children with special needs, every student is able to learn alongside their peers with the appropriate support.

Early Childhood

(Preschool 3s | Prek 4s | Jr. Kindergarten for Young 5s)

A loving, safe environment where creativity and playful learning meet

Our primary goal at this age is to help children experience the fun and joy that leads to an early excitement about learning.

At DCS, early childhood students will:

- Enjoy a play-based program that promotes active learning and preserves the magic of childhood
- Be cared for and nurtured in a Christcentered atmosphere that feels like a second home
- Explore the beauty of creation and learn about their place in God's world through our Creation rich outdoor learning curriculum
- Get ready for kindergarten using proven, age-appropriate curricula (Zoophonics, Handwriting Without Tears, CSI Bible, High Scope, etc.)

As an early childhood parent, you can expect:

- Experienced, dedicated teachers who hold ECE credentials and know how to foster an early excitement about learning
- Low student-to-teacher ratios: every early childhood classroom has two teachers which allows for individualized attention
- A partnership between home and school with regular, open communication between parents and staff



Kindergarten

Exploring their natural curiosity

Each child learns at their own pace, and knowing when your child is ready to start kindergarten can be a challenging decision. How will they perform academically? Will they thrive socially? What type of learning environment will best meet their needs?

We've built our program with the flexibility to meet each child where he or she is while providing a meaningful, hands-on learning experiences. We offer two options to serve students and families — **Full-Day Progressive Kindergarten**, which begins as a three-day program in the fall and transitions to four days after Christmas, and **Full-Day Enrichment Kindergarten**, which is five days throughout the school year.

Key skills your child will learn in kindergarten at DCS:

- How to read through a research-based, multi-sensory phonics program
- Problem-solving skills, as well as addition and subtraction through math manipulatives
- How to apply God's word to everyday interactions and relationships through engaging Bible stories
- Ways to discover the world through hands-on science lessons



A Whole-child Approach

Special subjects like STEM, art, music, library, and physical education allow students to discover their God-given gifts as they engage in active learning.

Exceptional Teachers

In small class sizes with dedicated kindergarten teachers and aides, students receive individual attention from energetic, creative educators.

Biblical Foundation

Students develop a biblical worldview early as they learn what it means to be kind, compassionate, honest, and forgiving.

Elementary School (Kindergarten-Grade 5)

Building a strong foundation for lifelong learners

Elementary students are engaged in hands-on exploration in a socially and emotionally supportive space. It's a time when deep and lasting friendships are formed, and students are challenged in an atmosphere that is collaborative and nurturing. Our small class sizes allow for differentiated instruction, which honors children as individuals who learn and develop at their own pace.



Academic Development:

Students will find a fun and challenging curriculum that includes Bible, Math, Reading, Social Studies, Science, Orton Gillingham Phonics, and Handwriting Without Tears.



Biblical Worldview:

At DCS, our Christian values extend beyond Bible class to permeate all areas of learning. Students participate in daily devotions, receive Christ-centered mentorship, complete service projects, and learn to effectively engage God's word.







Enriched Learning:

Art, music, library, physical education, STEM, and computer classes complement our core curriculum. Developing the whole child, we also utilize the <u>Harmony Social and</u> <u>Emotional Learning</u> (SEL) program in elementary school.

The leadership and teachers are dedicated and experienced educators that truly strive to know your child, meet them where they are at, and personalize and teach to the strengths of each student. The school also does a phenomenal job of educating the whole child, intentionally creating opportunities to build character, faith, servant leadership and critical thinking skills, as well as providing amazing enrichment opportunities.
